

It is our priority to ensure the highest level of safety for motor sport competitors, which is why it is compulsory to wear FIA-approved safety equipment when taking part in competitions inscribed in the FIA international calendar.

Safety doesn't need to be expensive and should always be accessible to competitors in any championship they wish to enter, which is why the FIA proposes a base and an advanced level of protection.



<u>This leaflet</u> provides information on the type of personal safety equipment that must be worn by competitors when the competition follows FIA Safety Regulations.

It includes an equipment checklist which shows the FIA Standard that each must comply with and a reference to the technical list that shows FIA-approved products. All of these can be accessed on the FIA website at <u>http://fia.com/homologations</u>.

There is information on the type of protection provided by each safety equipment, and a comparison of several parameters such as the minimum safety performance, and a comparison with the materials and technology used in the manufacturing process for entry-level and top-level products.

To ensure that drivers wear the correct type of clothing, they must check the minimum standard level in the Chapter III "Drivers' Equipment" of Appendix L to the International Sporting Code and look for the FIA hologram whenever they are purchasing motor sport safety equipment. The hologram makes it easy to identify which products have been subject to stringent FIA tests before being put on sale. It is important that competitors read the equipment instructions before using safety products. The majority of instructions are approved by the FIA Safety Department prior to being published, and all of them will provide very important information for competitors to benefit from the highest safety performance delivered by the product.
